3. **Please Slow Down:** As the weather gets nicer & daylight gets longer, children will be outside more often. Please slow down and be careful on our roads.



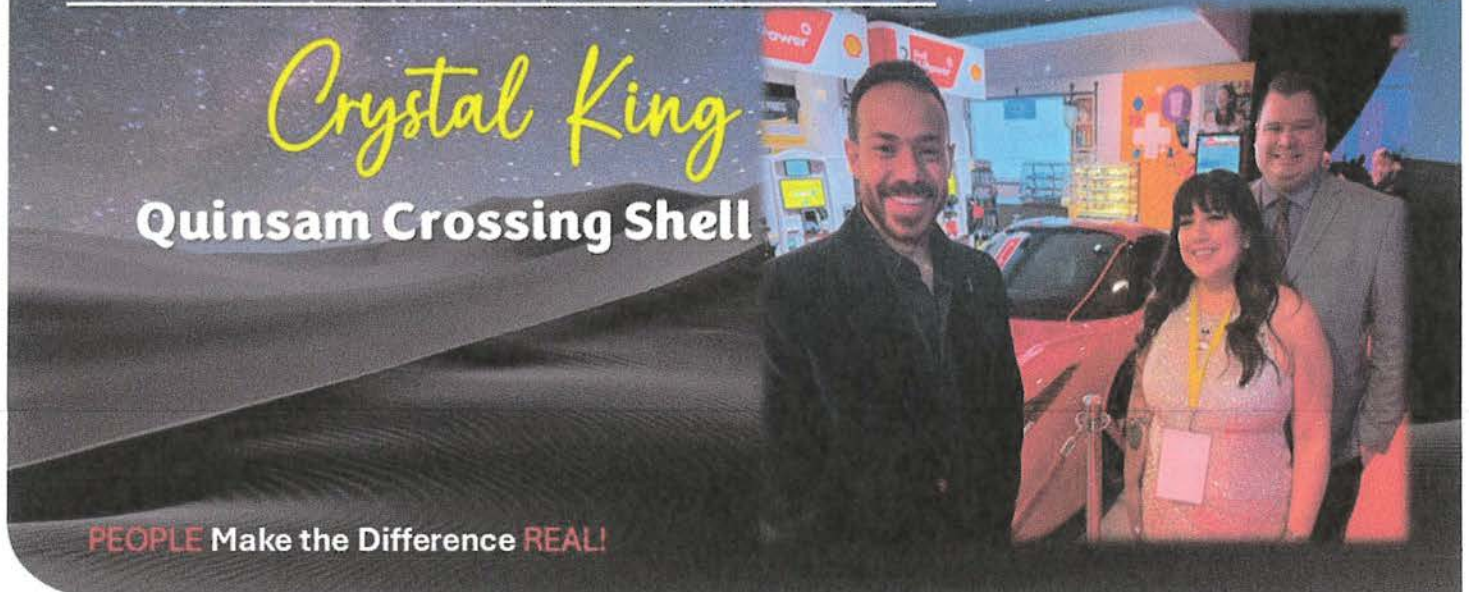

Sustainable Tourism Plan Engagement Process Launches for Quadra Island

Quadra Island, BC — The Discovery Islands Chamber of Commerce, in collaboration with the We Wai Kai Nation, is pleased to announce the launch of a **Sustainable Tourism Plan** engagement process for Quadra Island, beginning with a community session on **March 14, 2026**. This planning process will be shaped by local voices, grounded in community values, and focused on long-term community wellbeing.

The Sustainable Tourism Plan will build on Quadra Island's recently completed **Economic Diversification Plan** and will draw on the extensive community input gathered through that work. As it moves forward, the plan will support long-term economic vitality while protecting the environmental, social, and cultural values that make Quadra Island unique.

Tourism is already part of life on Quadra Island. This planning process is not about attracting more visitors at any cost. Instead, it will carefully consider local capacity and infrastructure realities, including transportation, services, and seasonal pressures.

“This plan will be about balance — supporting livelihoods while respecting our environment, our capacity, and our quality of life,” said **Carol Ann Terreberry**, President of the Discovery Islands Chamber of Commerce. “We heard clearly from residents and businesses during the Economic Diversification process. Rather than pursuing growth for growth's sake, this work will focus on quality over quantity, ensuring tourism contributes positively to community wellbeing and economic diversification.”

From the perspective of the **We Wai Kai Nation**, collaboration and care will be central to the process. “Tourism has a role to play in our shared future, but only when it is guided by respect, responsibility, and relationships,” said **Jason Wilson**, Director of Economic Development, We Wai Kai Nation. “This planning process is an opportunity to work together to ensure tourism supports community wellbeing, honours culture, and protects the lands and waters that sustain us all.”

As it unfolds, the Sustainable Tourism Plan will focus on practical, real-world priorities, including:

- Supporting local businesses and workers so they can thrive year-round
- Improving how visitors and peak seasons are managed
- Encouraging tourism that aligns with Quadra Island's values and limits
- Protecting ecosystems and natural resources
- Strengthening collaboration across the community

The Discovery Islands Chamber of Commerce encourages community members, businesses, and organizations who care about the future of Quadra Island to participate as the plan takes shape. Opportunities for engagement and input will be shared throughout the process. The Economic Diversification Plan can be viewed at quadraedp.ca.

Latest information when crossing the Canada-United States border as a person registered under the *Indian Act*



Here's what your community members need to know

Every country or territory decides who can enter or exit through its borders and the Government of Canada cannot intervene on behalf of Canadians who do not meet entry or exit requirements for the United States (U.S.).

Consular officials provide assistance to Canadians detained abroad (including by United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (commonly referred to as ICE)) in accordance with the [Canadian Consular Services Charter](#).

TIPS before you travel to the United States

Check [Travel advice and advisories for United States](#) for the latest information on safety and security, entry and exit requirements, consulate contact information, and more.

Sign up with the [Registration of Canadians Abroad](#) system to receive important updates.

If you're crossing the Canada-U.S. border for travel purposes with a status card

Registered persons, regardless of where they are born, have the right to enter and remain in Canada. Although any valid version of the status card can be presented to enter Canada, there may be a difference between the requirements to enter Canada and the requirements to enter the U.S.

While in the past you may have been able to enter the U.S. with any valid version of the status card, Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) now strongly recommends carrying a valid passport when you are travelling outside of Canada in addition to your Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS), also known as the secure status card.

If you're already registered under the Indian Act and need your secure status card on an urgent basis, for example, to return to Canada, you can apply at any time, free of charge, and request priority processing. **Acceptance of all status cards is entirely at the discretion of U.S. officials.**

Status cards can't be used to cross the Canada-U.S. border by air.

If you're entering the U.S. to live and work as a registered person

You may be asked to provide documentation to prove the percentage of Indian blood required under U.S. law. For example, they may request a letter from Indigenous Services Canada or your First Nation. Indigenous Services Canada can issue a letter of ancestry confirming registered ancestors, but it does not list a person's blood quantum. You may be asked for more documentation.

FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION



CNB is pleased to offer **FREE** income tax preparation services to lower income residents in your community.

This service is available to those who earn under \$25,000 per individual or \$40,000 for a couple per year **AND** who do not have fishing, business, or rental income.

An appointment is not required to participate in this service – all correspondence will occur via email.

If you are interested in and eligible for this service, please email samantha@cNBCpa.ca to get started.

Why should you file a tax return if you have lower income or do not owe any taxes nor expect a refund back?

If you do not file a tax return you are not eligible to receive GST credits or other provincial tax credits that may become available to you during the year. Filing your tax return ensures that you receive all cash payments and benefits that are available to yourself and your family.

Please note that the CRA has updated the authorization process, if you are interested in CNB preparing your return it is required that you have an active CRA account online **OR** can provide a Notice of Assessment from a previously filed tax year.

If you have accessed CNB's free service in a previous year it is **NOT** required that you possess an online account.
