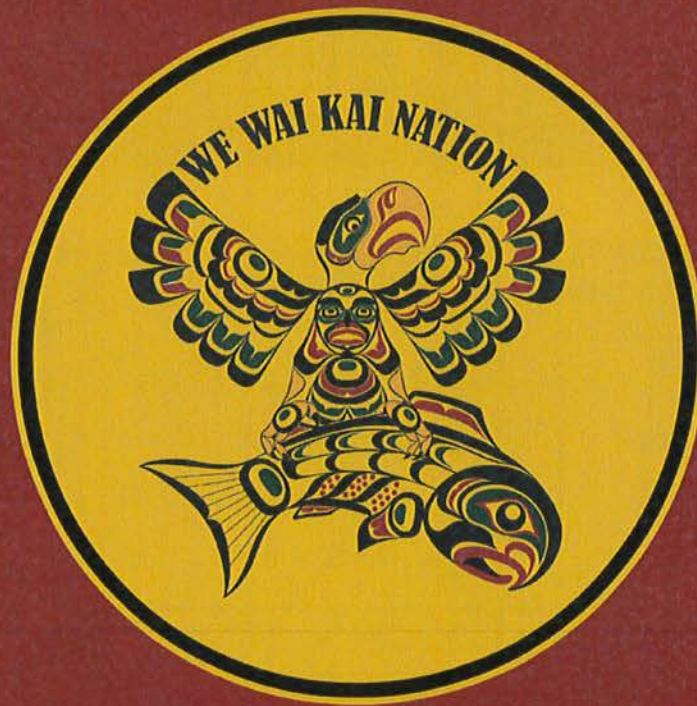

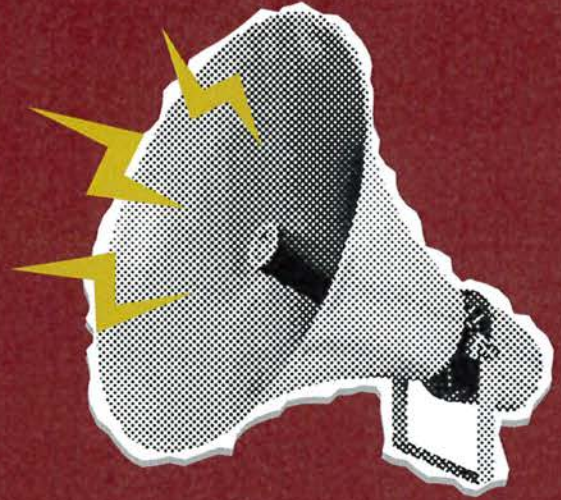

4. Personally accompany the license during all fishing activities.
5. Be the skipper of the vessel with a valid ticket to operate the vessel.
6. Identify the vessel being used:
 - o Vessel length must comply with license category restrictions.
 - o CSI documentation will be required from the successful applicant.
7. Provide proof of valid vessel insurance.
8. Same vessel may appear on multiple applications only if operators differ.

REGISTRATION AND SCHEDULING

Registration is open from Friday, February 06, 2026 at 01:51 PM until Tuesday, June 09, 2026 at 11:00 PM. Interested volunteers will be asked to indicate their availability and position preferences.

Shortly after registration closing, the Host Committee will circulate confirmed volunteer assignments for the Championship.

AVAILABLE POSITIONS

The following volunteer positions are available for this Championship:

- **Registration:** welcome players, distribute tee gifts and important Championship paperwork, and confirm player information
- **Scoring:** Receive scores from players at designated checkpoints and record unofficial scores to the Golf Genius mobile app.
- **Timing:** Record time that a group finishes the hole at designated checkpoints and enter time in Golf Genius mobile app. Convey any warnings to players and communicate times to BC Golf staff.
- **Walking Scoring:** walk with assigned player group and record unofficial scores to the Golf Genius mobile app.
- **Spotting:** Spotters will be positioned at particular areas on the golf course to assist players in locating balls or to help players determine the last point of entry for a ball finding a penalty area.

TRAINING

A Training & Volunteer Orientation call will be held on Microsoft Teams 24-48 hours before the Championship at time TBD. Recordings will be circulated to any volunteers unable to attend the call. The call will feature members of the Host Committee and BC Golf staff. The confirmed meeting time and call details will be circulated with the volunteer schedule.


